Kickapoo Conversations

Region: Includes Cashton, Westby, Viroqua, La Farge, Ontario

Mission: To bring about positive change in our community through the enduring broad-based relationships that make bold action possible

Recent Actions:

- **Shared Services Network:** The shared services network for childcare (WEESN) is enrolling providers and expanding beyond the initial area, after earning a significant multi-partner grant.
- **Flood Recovery & Response:** Relationships developed in Kickapoo Conversations proved invaluable in streamlining flood recovery efforts, which included a 10-community gathering to share challenges and strategies.

Upcoming Initiatives:

- **Community Connectedness:** Building multi-sector relationships across communities in the region, both with 1x1s and with community gatherings.
- **Leadership:** Inviting new participants to the “breakfast club”.
- **Flood Recovery:** Continuing relational and asset-based approach to recovery.

Southwest Partners

Region: Includes Richland Center, Rockbridge, Hillsboro

Mission: To create a healthy forward thinking culture for attracting, retaining, and nurturing people and their dreams in our region

Recent Actions:

- **Community Forum, Controversy to Community:** Brought community together to look at past & envision future, with a focus on the aquatic center & grocery store.
- **Community Prosperity Alliance (CPA):** Created an economic development entity using the relational model to grow the community & bring back optimism.
- **Community Foundation:** Created a community foundation to re-invest wealth in the community for the benefit of the community. A special IRS status allows the foundation to take equity positions in new & expanding business ventures.

Upcoming Initiatives:

- **Leadership:** Increasing leadership within SWP through a relational effort.
- **Safe Routes:** Developing walking & bicycling trails to work places and to schools outside the city proper.
- **Aquatic Center:** Partnering with the City of Richland Center to create a new \$5 million aquatic center in 2019.

Stronger Together Fox Valley

Region: Includes Fox Cities, Oshkosh

Mission: A network of citizens building relationships that make bold action possible

Recent Actions:

- **Community Connections:** Events included Dignity & Respect campaign; Latino Simulation; Living Room Conversation; relational workshop.
- **Neighborhood-School Partnership:** Connected local residents and neighborhood churches with middle school, to include a mentoring program and parent night, supporting kids, teachers, and parents with community.
- **Nonprofit Status:** Gained assets and infrastructure of previous fiscal sponsor.
- **Child Well-Being:** Facilitated conversations, highlighted area mentoring, and participated in regional coalition for End Child Poverty in Wisconsin.

Upcoming Initiatives:

- **Intergenerational Connections:** Holding two community conversations around intergenerational relationships, including mentoring.
- **Early Childhood:** Educational efforts around early childhood experiences, traumas, and needs, including Brain Architecture game and film screening.
- **Youth Transportation:** Organizing a program with World Relief to provide transportation for refugee students at “adopted” middle school.
